Junday School Corner



In our Fall unit, we begin our study of the New Testament, beginning with the announcement of Jesus' birth and continuing through the sending of the seventy-two. This morning, the kids studied the lesson "His Father's House – Boy Jesus in the Temple." As faithful Jews, Jesus' parents travel to Jerusalem each year for the Passover. Returning home one year, Mary and Joseph notice Jesus' absence, yet assume He is among the others in their traveling group. When

He doesn't appear, they return to Jerusalem, searching desperately for three days. They finally find Jesus in the temple, talking with the teachers, who are amazed at His understanding. Despite being in His "Father's house" (Luke 2:49), Jesus honors His earthly parents and returns to Nazareth with them. To reinforce this lesson with your kids, as a family, discuss, "Even though both Mary and Joseph were visited by angels at Jesus' birth, they were still not clear on who Jesus was—the Son of God. Sometimes, we are slow to understand God's Word too. This is why we spend a lifetime learning about God's Word. What are ways that we learn God's Word now? What about when we grow up? How will we continue to learn God's Word then? God calls us to different vocations in life. A vocation is a calling, a way that God calls us to serve Him and others. One of your vocations is that of son or daughter. In this narrative, we see Jesus obeying the Fourth Commandment by honoring His earthly father and mother, but we also see Him fulfilling His vocation of son. His parents are also fulfilling their vocation as parents by caring for their child and raising Him with God's Word. How does this work in our lives? How does God bless you through your vocation of son or daughter? How can you serve? How does God serve you through your parents?" Also, parents, you can join Pastor Krieg in the adult Sunday School class. See you next week!


High School Lesson

The high school youth have begun a new study focused on the Word of God. This study will help the kids gain a better understanding of the accuracy and reliability of the text we use today as the inspired Word of God. Over the next nine lessons, the students will focus on the following:

- Jesus Christ: The Center of the Bible
- The Holy Scriptures God's Word
- The Canon God Preserves His True Word
- Understanding God's Word
- Figurative Language The Richness of Scripture
- Biblical Types, Symbols, and Poetry
- Recognizing False Teaching
- Bible Translations

Today, our high school class studied the lesson, *Biblical Types, Symbols, and Poetry*. This lesson focuses on how God's Word includes types, symbols, and poetry. These elements of literature give Scripture a richness in meaning and, like the rest of the Bible, point us to Christ Jesus, the way of salvation.

St. Paul's letter to the Romans is often called the "chief part of the New Testament." Romans clearly lays out the heart of the Christian faith: we are justified by grace alone through faith alone on account of Christ alone. In this rich epistle, Paul teaches on sin and righteousness, law and Gospel, baptism, the struggle against the old Adam, and life lived in the

freedom of the Gospel. Whether you've been attending or have yet to join us, this is a wonderful time to dig into God's Word together and grow in our understanding of His mercy in Christ. Come and be strengthened in the faith that saves and learn how the Gospel shapes our daily lives. We look forward to studying this treasure of Scripture with you! If you could not attend today, please join us next Sunday during the Adult Bible Study hour before church, starting at 9 a.m. Now is the time to commit yourself to a deeper and more meaningful understanding of God's Word and your relationship with Him. I hope to see you all next Sunday as we continue our studies.
