COMMUNION STATEMENT



Furthermore, participation in the Sacrament is a sign of our unity in the faith with all those who join us at the altar. For that reason, we ask that



Our denial of admission to those who are members of another confession is not a judgment upon their faith but a recognition that we hold to different confessions concerning God, salvation, and the Sacrament itself. Such individuals are invited to speak with the pastor following the service.

As we prepare for the Thanksgiving season, our Board of Missions invites everyone to take part in a Canned Food Drive to support the vital work of



Sunday School Corner



In our Fall unit, we begin our study of the New Testament, beginning with the announcement of Jesus' birth and continuing through the sending of the seventy-two. This morning, the kids studied the lesson "A Confident Confession – Peter Confesses Christ." "Who do people say I am?" and "Who do you say I am?" (Matthew 16:13, 15). Peter's bold confession, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (v. 16), prompts Jesus to commend his words and proclaim this

truth as the rock upon which the Church will be built. When Jesus foretells His death and resurrection, Peter objects and becomes a hindrance to Jesus' mission. Jesus rebukes Peter and keeps His focus on the cross. To reinforce this lesson with your kids, as a family, discuss, The Bible talks about one Church. Why do we have different churches? What's the difference between the church that you go to every week and the Church? Not long after making his great confession, Peter finds himself being rebuked by Jesus. How does knowing that we are forgiven through Jesus' death and resurrection help us share His message of salvation? A creed is a statement of what you believe. Creeds have been used by Christians since Peter confessed, "You are the Christ!" Why is it important for a church to have a common creed? Also, parents, you can join Pastor Krieg in the adult Sunday School class. See you next week!

High School Lesson


The high school youth have begun a new study focused on the Word of God. This Our High School Sunday School class is beginning a new study series using Not-So-Nice Bible Stories: Master Criminals. In this engaging and thought-provoking study, students will explore the stories of some of Scripture's most notorious wrongdoers, and discover how God's mercy and grace still shine through even the darkest human deeds. Each lesson points us to Christ, who took the punishment for all sin upon Himself and gives us forgiveness, life, and salvation. Join us as we dig into God's Word, wrestle with tough questions, and see how even "master criminals" reveal our need for the one true Savior, Jesus Christ.

Lesson 2 – The Call of Blood (Genesis 4:1–16)

Today in class, our High School Sunday students envisaged Cain and Abel in "The Call of Blood." Students explored how jealousy and sin took root in Cain's heart and led to the first murder in human history. Yet even in the midst of judgment, God's mercy remained. We discussed how the blood of Abel cries out for justice, but the

blood of Christ speaks a better word—one of forgiveness, reconciliation, and peace. Through this story, our students saw how the cross answers sin's violence with God's redeeming grace and how Christ's sacrifice covers even the darkest parts of the human heart.

Adult Sunday School Lesson



St. Paul's letter to the Romans is often called the "chief part of the New Testament." Romans clearly lays out the heart of the Christian faith: we are justified by grace alone through faith alone on account of Christ alone. In this rich epistle, Paul teaches on sin and righteousness, law and Gospel,

baptism, the struggle against the old Adam, and life lived in the freedom of the Gospel. Whether you've been attending or have yet to join us, this is a wonderful time to dig into God's Word together and grow in our understanding of His mercy in Christ. Come and be strengthened in the faith that saves and learn how the Gospel shapes our daily lives. We look forward to studying this treasure of Scripture with you! If you could not attend today, please join us next Sunday during the Adult Bible Study hour before church, starting at 9 a.m. Now is the time to commit yourself to a deeper and more meaningful understanding of God's Word and your relationship with Him. I hope to see you all next Sunday as we continue our studies.


