



In Light of 1 Cor. 11:23-26, Bethlehem Lutheran Church maintains the historical practice of "closed" communion in the belief that the Sacrament requires faith in Christ's words that His body and blood are truly present. Furthermore, participation in the Sacrament is a sign of our unity in the faith with all those who join us at the altar. *For that reason*,

we ask that those visitors desiring to commune be members in good standing of a congregation of the LCMS and speak to the pastor or an elder before the beginning of the service. Our denial of admission to those who are members of another confession is not a judgment upon their faith but a recognition that we hold to different confessions concerning God, salvation, and the Sacrament itself. Such individuals are invited to speak with the pastor following the service.

Sunday School Corner



In our Fall unit, we begin our study of the New Testament, beginning with the announcement of Jesus' birth and continuing through the sending of the seventy-two. This morning, the kids studied the lesson "A Water Wonder – Jesus Walks on Water." Jesus takes His inner circle—Peter, James, and John—up on a mountain. There, they see Jesus in His heavenly glory as Moses and Elijah appear alongside Him,

discussing His upcoming departure. In his excitement, Peter offers to build three tents so they can remain on the mountaintop. Suddenly, a cloud—a sign of God's presence—appears and a voice speaks out from it: "This is My Son, My Chosen One; listen to Him!" (Luke 9:35). To reinforce this lesson with your kids, as a family, discuss: Can you think of the most exciting, best day you've ever had? What was it?

Sometimes we call this type of event a "mountaintop experience." Can you stay up there on the mountaintop all the time? If Jesus had done as Peter suggested and stayed up there on the mountain, what would He have missed out on doing? Why is it important for us that Jesus didn't just pitch a tent up there and stay there? Jesus used this event to strengthen the faith of the disciples. How does Jesus strengthen our faith today? When do we see Jesus? When will we see Jesus in all His glory? Do you ever think about that or look forward to that? How does that help you when you think about someone you know who has gone on to heaven? Also, parents, you can join Pastor Krieg in the adult Sunday School class. See you next week!


High School Lesson

Our High School Sunday School class is beginning a new study series using Not-So-Nice Bible Stories: Master Criminals. In this engaging and thought-provoking study, students will explore the stories of some of Scripture's most notorious wrongdoers, and discover how God's mercy and grace still shine through even the darkest human deeds. Each lesson points us to Christ, who took the punishment for all sin upon Himself and gives us forgiveness, life, and salvation. Join us as we dig into God's Word, wrestle with tough questions, and see how even "master criminals" reveal our need for the one true Savior, Jesus Christ.

Lesson 4 – Getting His Goat (Genesis 27)

This week, our High School Sunday School class studied Jacob's deception of his father, Isaac, in "Getting His Goat." Students examined how Jacob and Rebekah resorted to lies, disguises, and manipulation to secure the blessing, a vivid reminder of how sin spreads when we try to take God's promises into our own hands. Yet even through this tangled mess of deceit, God's gracious purposes were not undone. We discussed how the Lord works His salvation despite human scheming, ultimately fulfilled in Christ, the true Firstborn who received the curse of our sin so that we might receive His blessing.

Adult Sunday School Lesson



St. Paul's letter to the Romans is often called the "chief part of the New Testament." Romans clearly lays out the heart of the Christian faith: we are justified by grace alone through faith alone on account of Christ alone. In this rich epistle, Paul teaches on sin and righteousness, law and Gospel, baptism, the struggle against the old Adam, and life

lived in the freedom of the Gospel. Whether you've been attending or have yet to join us, this is a wonderful time to dig into God's Word together and grow in our understanding of His mercy in Christ. Come and be strengthened in the faith that saves and learn how the Gospel shapes our daily lives. We look forward to studying this treasure of Scripture with you! If you could not attend today, please join us next Sunday during the Adult Bible Study hour before church, starting at 9 AM Now is the time to commit yourself to a deeper and more meaningful understanding of God's Word and your relationship with Him.
