Sunday School Corner



In our Fall unit, we begin our study of the New Testament, beginning with the announcement of Jesus' birth and continuing through the sending of the seventy-two. This morning, the kids studied the lesson "A Water Wonder – Jesus Walks on Water." Jesus takes His inner circle—Peter, James, and John—up on a mountain. There, they see Jesus in His heavenly glory as Moses and Elijah appear alongside Him, discussing His upcoming departure. In his excitement, Peter

offers to build three tents so they can remain on the mountaintop. Suddenly, a cloud—a sign of God's presence—appears and a voice speaks out from it: "This is My Son, My Chosen One; listen to Him!" (Luke 9:35). To reinforce this lesson with your kids, as a family, discuss: Can you think of the most exciting, best day you've ever had? What was it? Sometimes we call this type of event a "mountaintop experience." Can you stay up there on the mountaintop all the time? If Jesus had done as Peter suggested and stayed up there on the mountain, what would He have missed out on doing? Why is it important for us that Jesus didn't just pitch a tent up there and stay there? Jesus used this event to strengthen the faith of the disciples. How does Jesus strengthen our faith today? When do we see Jesus? When will we see Jesus in all His glory? Do you ever think about that or look forward to that? How does that help you when you think about someone you know who has gone on to heaven? Also, parents, you can join Pastor Krieg in the adult Sunday School class. See you next week!


High School Lesson

Our High School Sunday School class is beginning a new study series using Not-So-Nice Bible Stories: Master Criminals. In this engaging and thought-provoking study, students will explore the stories of some of Scripture's most notorious wrongdoers, and discover how God's mercy and grace still shine through even the darkest human deeds. Each lesson points us to Christ, who took the punishment for all sin upon Himself and gives us forgiveness, life, and salvation. Join us as we dig into God's Word, wrestle with tough questions, and see how even "master criminals" reveal our need for the one true Savior, Jesus Christ.

Lesson 5 – Flirt Like an Egyptian (Genesis 39)

In this week's lesson, our High School class explored Joseph's encounter with Potiphar's wife in "Flirt Like an Egyptian." Students looked at how temptation, false accusation, and injustice played out in Joseph's life, and how God remained with him through it all. Even when Joseph suffered for doing what was right, the Lord preserved him and worked through his trials for a greater purpose. We discussed how Christ, too, was falsely accused and unjustly condemned, yet through His suffering brought about our salvation. Joseph's story points us to the One who is with us in every trial and who turns even evil intentions toward His saving plan.

Adult Sunday School Lesson
