





MCC's School Kit Challenge is back, and we are joining the challenge! School kits provide essential supplies that families navigating war, displacement or financial struggles would not be able to buy otherwise. MCC hopes to provide 25,000 school kits for 25,000 kids this summer. Items to include in the kit: 4 spiral notebooks (70 pages each); 8 new, unsharpened pencils; 1 ruler (flat, good quality, must indicate 30 cm); 12 colored pencils (in original packaging); 1 large eraser; 4 new blue or black ballpoint pens; 1 small, all-metal pencil sharpener. Bring your items and place them in the box under the coat racks. We will dedicate all the school kits on Christian Education Sunday on September 14.

The Grant Recipient sign in the church yard is for the grant that VBS received from the Halstead Community Foundation. The grant helps provides supplies for Imagination Station and the Bible Buddies that are sent home each day with each child. We are thankful for the Foundation's support of the VBS program!
