Course work Categories

• 3 ring Binder

- This is where students will keep work, notes, papers, projects, and activities done in class and or given out.
- Each binder will need to be organized.
- There will be a binder check at the end of each unit. This counts as an assignment grade.

• Student Activity Manual (Workbook)

- Assignments will be given out regularly through here; class/HW assignments. This is what students will use to master the topics covered in class.
- This workbook will cover grammar and writing tools.

Assignments/Projects

- Assignments will be given out regularly and any assignments not finished in class, shall be for homework.
- Assignments shall include worksheets, section questions, notes, and projects.
- Projects may include individual or group activity.
- There will also be larger assignments such as research papers, essays, timelines, etc.

Tests/Quizzes

- Students will receive tests and quizzes to demonstrate their mastery of the subject.
- Each test will be given at the end of the Unit and each quiz will be weekly or bi-weekly on Fridays.
- Students will know few days prior to the test when it will be given.
- Students will also have study guides to look over for each test.
- Tests and quizzes are multiple choice with a chance of free response questions.
- Students may make up tests and quizzes if absent and or have a valid excuse.

Classroom Behavioral Expectations

Classroom Consequences

• For not following the above guidelines, students may get any of the following: parental contact, lunch detention, immediate removal from classroom, referral to the office, etc. With the exception of extreme behaviors that warrant immediate removal, it's my policy to warn students first before assigning these consequences. I will give the student the opportunity to do what is right after their first warning, if it persists then, one of the above consequences will take place. These will results from their actions and must show proactive action in class.

Late/Make up Work:

- Late work ais deducted 10% off the grade for the first day its late, and subsequent 5% off each day after that.
- Make up work from excused absences must be turned in the corresponding number of days missed. For example, if the student is absent Monday and Tuesday and returns to school on Wednesday, the make up work is due Friday. As well as the student is responsible for getting assignments and any handouts.
- If student is absent for test or quiz day, that student is responsible to make up the exam. If students are unable to make up the exam within 3 days of returning to school, they will receive a 0 for the exam. They must let me know first to make it up.

Attendance:

Regular attendance is crucial to academic success. If you must be absent due to illness or other issues make sure that you get your missed work and turn it in on time to receive full credit
