

The Soroptimist International Convention was held in Dublin, Ireland in July, with over 1700 Soroptimist members from around the world. I was able to meet many members from so many countries — Iceland, Australia, Germany and more. I had a nice conversation with two members from SI/Kisumu who expressed their gratitude to Founder Region, and SI/EI Cerrito in particular, for the period packets that have been sent to them for the girls in their community. We had over 30 members from Founder Region in attendance at the convention, however, in two attempts, we were not able to get all of us into one photo. You should be able to see most of us on the various Facebook posts that have been made.

There were so many speakers at convention with various topics important to us as Soroptimists. Of the highlights were keynote speaker Mary Robinson, the first woman President of Ireland, elected in 1990, and Renata Dwan, policy expert on peace and conflict issues with the United Nations. I was also very interested in the presentations by the presidents of the five federations. So much is going on to improve the lives of women and girls. I hope that summaries of the speakers and workshops will be posted on the SI website.

There was the unveiling of the new Soroptimist International logo (please do not confuse this with the "S" logo for SIA). You have probably already seen this logo if you have been on social media. Also was the introduction of the incoming 2024-2025 SI President, Siew Yong Gnanalingam from Malaysia. She was unable to attend in person, but presented a video highlighting how we can help with climate change. Then there was much celebration over the announce-



ment that the 2027 convention will be an Alaska cruise. Save your pennies for this great adventure.

This summer has gone by so quickly. If your club was "dark" during the summer months, your meetings will be starting up again soon. I highly encourage clubs to go back to meeting in person again as the fellowship of being together is so important for the nourishment and growth of a club. ## Membership - Chair Lyn Lurbe

#### INTRODUCTION FORMS

When a prospective member is curious about Soroptimist, they will submit an *Introduction Form* from the SIA website.

The introduction form will ask for the potential member's personal contact information and is sent to the nearest club according to the individual's zip code. It will also ask how they heard of our organization and what would be their reason for joining.

This is another resource that SIA has developed for our clubs to reach out to potential

individuals interested/curious about our organization.

Surveys were done on the introduction forms and have found four areas that potential members are looking for in volunteer organizations.

- **1. Relationships** nearly 75% indicated that they sought "friendship and fellowship" and being with "like-minded people".
- **2. Mission** 68% indicated they are interested in joining because of the personal connection to our mission.

- **3. Personal Growth** 63% hoped to gain leadership and personal development opportunities.
- **4. Volunteer Opportunities** 62% are interested in hands-on opportunities in volunteer work.

If your club supports and provides these opportunities, then the prospective member is a perfect match for your club! While recruiting, consider these four areas while connecting with the potential members because this is what is important to them and will entice them to join Soroptimist!

## Public Awareness - Chair Kris Chorbi

As we begin a new club year, have you identified your club Public Awareness chair? The club publicity chair is an important leadership role! This role is responsible for increasing awareness of Soroptimist and your club in your local community and beyond. While having an interest in and excitement about promoting Soroptimist is a must, anyone who is well-informed about their club and the Soroptimist mission could fulfill this position.

As your club's publicity chair, knowing when important dates are coming up is key. Here is a list of important dates to keep in mind when developing your club's publicity calendar. Your

There should be some worthwhile information there. If you are not available at that time, it will be taped and available on the SIA website. The Founder Region Board will

also be looking at what Live Your Dream resources are available.

You never know where the next recipient may be found and there may be new members out there as well. Bottom line, let's increase our number of awards. Remember SIA looks at the number of awards given to determine what funding will be received for additional awards to our recipients.

An updated Violet Richardson Award application will be on the website soon. We are looking to see if that application could be modified to allow for the possibility that a Violet Richardson Award would qualify as a Big Goal Accelerator Project. More information to come on that.

Start out by reviewing the <u>Planning Toolkit</u> <u>Overview.</u> It provides the necessary steps to host a DI,BI project and can be used to help guide your planning.

To keep on top of the planning process, set a target date to complete each step. Then note important details related to each task. Varying aspects in your planning process will change the order of these steps—and some steps can even happen simultaneously. So simply make adjustments as you go!

Begin with small steps. Completing just one of the seven sessions from the Dream It, Be It curriculum makes your club eligible to receive participation credit. Please let me know how I can help or if you have any

questions. (FYI: The Founder Region Board will be reviewing grants at their August 11-13 meeting.)
