By now, your clubs have selected the recipients of your Live Your Dream Award(s) and Violet Richardson Award(s) for this club year. Great work and many thanks to Live Your Dream Region Chair Debbie Coles and the District chairs as well as to the District Violet Richardson Award chairs.

Did you know that, for every 30 Live Your Dream Awards given in our Region, SIA gives the Region \$3000.00. This is in addition to the \$5000.00 award for the Region Live Your Dream winner. This means that if, as a Region, there are 120 Live Your Dream Awards given, the Region receives \$12,000.00. This funds a \$3000.00 award to each District winner. Again, that is in addition to the

\$5000.00 award to the overall Region award winner. This is why it is important for every club to participate and to give as many Live Your Dream Awards as you can. Keep up the good work; we are getting there.

Get started early. Be thinking about identifying your club's 2024-2025 Live Your Dream Award chair now. Once that person is identified, she can begin learning about the process and be ready to hit the ground running next fall. I know many clubs go dark during July and August. The SIA Live Your Dream portal opens in August. Let's get a jump on that.

Your club may have a great idea for a new project but be in need of some financial help to complete it. Remember that club grant applications are due

by March 1, 2023. Take advantage of the opportunity to potentially obtain funding for your club's project. Don't miss out.

Be sure to report your Dream It Be It projects online to SIA no later than June 1, 2024. No need to wait though. If your club has completed a project turn it in.

Of course, keep those Big Goal Accelerator Projects going. Lots of excellent ideas out there. The results are amazing. Let me know if I can help in any way.

Have you lost your audience? Do students appear to be zoning out in the middle of a Dream It, Be It session? Well it's to be expected. The seven sessions, which make up the DI, BI curriculum, are designed to take from 50 to 75 minutes to complete. This can be A LONG time for girls (and some adults) to focus!

This is where taking a *movement break* comes in. SIA has provided the following examples of movement break activities, which are included in the DI, BI Curriculum:

- ⇒ Box Breathing
- ⇒ Chair Action
- ⇒ Hiking
- ⇒ Padding
- ⇒ Shake It
- ⇒ Freeze and Justify
- ⇒ Family Portrait

Look at each Dream It, Be It session first and determine the best time for your pacing to have a movement break. Each break takes no longer than five minutes. Feel free to incorporate your own ideas. It's time to get moving!

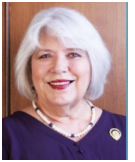

Region Leadership Spotlight

Sylvia Crafton, Parliamentarian 2022-2024

I grew up on a farm in Pennsylvania and when I was a sophomore in high school, my Dad sold the farm which had been in the family since 1799, because it was too steep for modern equipment, and bought a beautiful farm in Ohio. I was not thrilled to give up my friendships in PA and move to OH, but I quickly made friends in my new school, and was even elected as Student Council President my senior year. This positive experience was empowering and opened my eyes and heart to the opportunities that come with changes - like moving and encountering new people and places.

I met my husband, Andrew Crafton at the University of Akron, where we both played the French Horn. I was majoring in music education, and he majored in accounting; we married in 1980, shortly after I graduated. We stayed in OH for a year, where I did substitute teaching and occasional French Horn performance jobs; then Andrew took a job in Texas, so I was on the move again. In Texas, I taught French Horn lessons

and did substitute teaching and then I got the bug to be in the travel industry and started working in Reservations at Continental Airlines. Now, we could fly! Next, Andrew took a job in Guam in 1990; now, that was a major move! We played in community orchestras in both Texas and Guam, and we continue to play duets on our horns in our church services regularly.

When we moved to Guam, I made a few friends, but when I joined Soroptimist International of the Marianas, I finally felt like I belonged there. They put me to work right away on the games committee of our biggest fundraiser, called the "Battle of the Executives". It was a lot of work and a lot of responsibility and a lot of commitment, but it was also a lot of fun! I developed many friendships by working together on volunteer projects.

Because I worked for an airline, I was frequently the only Soroptimist member who could easily travel to conferences and conventions, so I had great opportunities to develop friendships with women from around the world who have a shared vision to improve the lives of

women and girls. I was fortunate to be elected twice as District Director for my district and served from 2008-2012; I was elected as Governor-elect in 2016, and enjoyed serving as Founder Region Governor for the 2018-2020 biennium which unfortunately had a COVID pandemic lockdown overshadowing its ending.

I retired from United Airlines in 2014, and after Andrew retired, we decided it was time to move back to the states to be closer to family. In 2022, we settled in Babcock Ranch, FL - "America's first solar-powered town", and we love it here.



As we go through the changes at various stages in our lives, like a butterfly, we may stumble and fall as we emerge from one stage to another, and that is ok. As we learn and grow, we will achieve new goals, gain maturity, and thereby we continue to Empower Change.

Founder Region Committee Descriptions

Live Your Dream Awards - This committee requires a chair and representatives from each district who are responsible for planning, coordinating and administering the award at district and region levels. Committee members also serve as a resource for club members.

Dream It, Be It: Career Support for Girls will help girls grow up to be strong, successful, happy adults. The committee requires a chair and representatives from each district who are responsible to encourage clubs to participate in the program.

Violet Richardson - This committee requires representatives from each district who are responsible for coordinating and administering the judging for the award at district level for presentation at Region Conference.

Membership - A committee of at least one member from each district which serves as a resource for clubs needing assistance with recruitment and retention; acting under the direction of the Region Board in cooperation with Federation for extension, formation, orientation and nurturing of new clubs in the Region.

Fundraising - A committee consisting of a chair and representatives from each district who are responsible for overseeing the SIA/Region Program Fundraiser conducted at our annual conference.

Public Awareness - A committee of at least three members who assist clubs to increase the visibility of the organization and help to promote the awareness of Soroptimist within the Region. The chair works closely with Federation to develop and implement the necessary resources and strategies to meet public awareness goals.

"S" Club - a committee consisting of a chair and interested members. The chair coordinates the region activities of "S" Clubs at the direction of the governor.

Law and Resolutions - reviews current club bylaws to ensure compliance with region and federation bylaws and procedures. Chair confers with the governor as to proposed amendments and resolutions, and, working in conjunction with the Parliamentarian, previews and presents amendments to the region bylaws at the annual business meeting of the region.

Legislative Advocacy - coordinates the accumulation and dissemination of information of topics of interest related to our mission and established programs. Works with the governor on a program for Region Conference.

Financial Review Committee - A committee consisting of three Founder Region Soroptimist members who have at least two years of experience as an accountant or bookkeeper, and have served at least two years as a club or region treasurer. The committee shall be responsible for conducting the financial review of the Treasurer's Books at the end of each biennium.

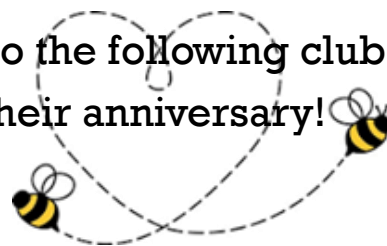
