Where can clubs find eligible Live Your Dream applicants?

Some of our Founder Region clubs find many eligible LYD applicants. Most of these clubs have established relationships with their local schools and certified job training programs. What if your club is in a community that does not have schools or certified training programs?

Attendees at the recent Founder Region Leadership Trainings discussed this difficult issue and many suggestions emerged. Has your club considered the following suggestions?

Churches - may know of a qualified applicant Childcare facilities - may know a head of household woman who is back in school Vocational/technical training schools for any skill i.e. massage and beautician training, auto repair, electronics, plumbing G.E.D. programs for women who are completing their high school graduation Send out a public service announcement to your local newspaper and radio Post flyers in public gathering places

Consider contacting schools and certified job training programs in a nearby town to see if any scholarship candidates live in your area. The woman may live in your community but is receiving her education elsewhere.

Another suggestion from the Leadership Trainings is to partner with near-by Soroptimist clubs who have a lot of applications. Your club can offer to help review applications for a club who has "extras". Please contact me at <u>MaidaRHIA@aol.com</u> if you want names of clubs who consistently receive many applications.
