On January 9, 2024, SIA will be presenting a Club Grant webinar. Does your club have a great idea, but not quite the funding to complete it? This may be a solution. Club Grant applications are due by March 1, 2024.

There is just about a month until the November 15 deadline for Live Your Dream applications. Make sure that your club is letting potential applicants know about this opportunity. Make sure applicants know that the location of

their educational opportunity is not a key issue in looking at applications. Also, be prepared to share applications. Our mission is to help women and girls; think big when you define your "community". Make sure your club's recipient or recipients are reported through the on-line portal by February 1, 2024.

How are your Dream It Be projects going? This does not have to be a big scary thing to do. Maybe start small and look forward to growing in the future.

Keep those Big Goal Accelerator projects coming. Can we do a 10% increase in those projects in 2023-2024 over 2022-2023? I think we can. An interesting factoid-92% of Big Goal Accelerator projects which are submitted are eligible. Your club can do this.

As always, know that there are people available to help with any of these programs. Contact your District chairs, your Region chairs or me. The only "dumb question" is the one you didn't ask.



Swag Bags for Dream It, Be It Participants

Barbara Young from SI/Santa Rosa asked me about suggestions for swag bag "stuff" for Dream It, Be It participants. Good question, thank you Barbara! So I will share my outcome with everyone else.

Barbara's question came at the perfect time, as the DI,BI Region chairs were meeting (on Zoom) for our regular monthly meeting led by the SIA Program Director. I took the opportunity and asked them for swag bag suggestions, and here are their responses:

- -Affirmation boxes (clear plastic) or a list that girls can choose from or create their own. Use different colored paper so it's fun and pretty.
- -Stress balls
- -Small notebook and pen to journal
- -Candy (seasonal)
- -Bag/backpack/cinch bag (local businesses can donate)
- -Hand sanitizer
- -Small mirror
- -Period products
- -Colored pencils & coloring pages to relax
- -Snacks
- -T-shirts

Take a plain white gift bag and put the DI,BI logo on it, to hold swag items. Give swag goodies at the end of the completed sessions so it's not distracting! Distribute them once the student evaluation is turned in.

Recommended sites to order: Oriental Trading Company or Dollar Tree.

I hope this will give you some new ideas. It was noted that while the SIA store has Dream It, Be It items, they are expensive. My club (SI/Martinez) bought the DI,BI bracelet and the pocket folder using Founder Region grant monies. Have fun!


