THE ELEVATOR SPEECH

I know some of you cringe when you hear of having your own elevator speech. Don't worry, the more involved you are with your club, the faster you will develop your speech. Just be patient and give it time to mature into something wonderful and inviting!

You will hear a little more about this at the District Meetings but the key point to remember is that everyone's speech should be their own. Continue to practice the key points of your speech because as time goes on, it will

evolve and continue to get better and seamless. In fact, you may be able to create several elevator speeches depending on the situations, the various environments/activities you are involved in, and the different people you will encounter. One speech may be about the organization, another may be about the Live Your Dream Program, or the Dream It, Be It Program, or a club project that you are excited about. Create and Excite!

Keep in mind that an elevator speech should be brief about 30-60 seconds, make it personal, be positive and persuasive in your message, and above all ... practice makes it perfect! Once you've mastered your speech(es), it'll become a natural way of starting a conversation about Soroptimist!

Have fun with your speeches!




Public Awareness - Chair Kris Chorbi

"S" Club Start-Up Grants
Founder Region Procedures state that up to
\$500.00 can be granted for start-up costs,
which could include promotional materials,
refreshments for recruiting events, charter
parties, t-shirts, pins and other costs associated with starting up an "S" Club. Applications
will be reviewed by the Founder Region
Board and "S" Club Committee. Please allow
60 days for approval process.

"S" Club Project Grants
Founder Region has a special fund designated for "S" Clubs. The money is collected each year from clubs in the region. This money is

designated to help start "S" Clubs, and to help "S" Clubs with girl-focused projects. Up to \$500.00 can be granted for girl-focused projects. Applications will be reviewed by the Founder Region Board and "S" Club Committee. Please allow 60 days for approval process.

Dream It, Be It Grants

Founder Region has a special fund designated for club Dream It, Be It projects. The money is collected each year from clubs in the region. Founder Region Procedures state that up to \$500 can be granted to a club for their Dream It, Be It project.

I'm happy to report that the Founder Region Board will continue to honor DI,BI grants this year! It was noted that once the money in reserve for these grants is gone, the grants will probably be discontinued. Only one grant can be received per project. Funds are limited. Additionally, the grant process will likely be re-evaluated during the 2024-2026 biennium. Open grant application:

Please note: The Founder Region Board stated that while it's a good thing to participate in *Get Real Academy* (a DI,BI project/collaboration among multiple clubs), the Board would really like clubs to start new projects within the schools in their communities.
