

## Governor's December Message

I had the privilege of attending a SIA Region Leaders meeting by Zoom last week. I am going to use some of this space this month to tell you about some things you need to know.

There was much discussion of the upcoming SIA Convention in Incheon, South Korea in July. The theme for the convention is "Inspiring Dreams." The mandatory convention fee is due from each club by March 15, 2026, to SIA. Invoices will be sent out to the clubs on January 1, 2026. Those fees cover the general business meeting, convention expenses, and registration for one club delegate. On January 2, 2026, there will be a Relief Application released. The criteria are the club's financial difficulty in paying the fee. A final decision will be made on the Relief Applications by March 2, 2026, and clubs will be notified. After March 16, 2026, there will be a 10% late fee applied. As of April 1, 2026, any club not paying the fee (after review of any Relief Application) will be in danger of losing its charter. Do not let that happen to your club.

In January 2026, new region bylaws templates will be released. The next step will be for the region to review the templates and make any updates to our bylaws which may be necessary. This will all need to be completed by June 2028.

Club bylaws templates will be released by mid-2026. There will be adjustments requested to each club's bylaws following that. More is also forthcoming on the Code of Conduct.

We are 28% of the way to accomplishing the SIA Big Goal of reaching 500,000 women and girls by 2031. Let's keep up the excellent work in Founder Region. There will shortly be a survey to assess what new ideas should be started to help toward reaching the Big Goal, what efforts should be stopped, and what new ideas should be tried.

The efforts are continuing on SIA's new technology. Again, patience is the word!

Hopefully, this brings you up to date on some new information. A very happy holiday season to all of you from the Founder Region Board and especially me, **Governor Elise.**

## Live Your Dream- Maida Herbst-Chair

Clubs that get their #1 winners to their District Representatives by January 15 will be included in an incentive program. All final reports are due on February 1.

If you need more applications, now is the time to request them. Please contact your District Representative or me and we will assist you.

All clubs must review each of their applications to be sure the applicant is eligible. If you are transferring an application, you need to determine eligibility before the transfer. If you have any questions about an application, you can ask your questions through the application system or you can email or call the applicant to get your answers. If you use the application system, the application will leave your dashboard until the applicant goes on-line and answers your question.

SIA asks us to remind clubs that they must give a CASH AWARD to an eligible applicant! Unless she requests otherwise, the funds must be given directly to the applicant.

ANYONE who reads applications, including club members and judges, must have signed a confidentiality agreement which the club should retain in their records.

SIA has eligible applications from areas where there is no Soroptimist club. If your club is interested in non-local applications, let me know because every woman, whether she's in your backyard or across the country, deserves a chance to have her application evaluated so she can live her dreams.
