In the 23 years since inception, 1000 pastors and individuals have joined them in spreading the Gospel to nearly 60 countries and counting. It is the goal of Help Ministries to train local pastors to reach their people.

Multiple outreach ministries work through the church, including the ministry of gym chaplaincy.

Jimmy and Shelley are missionaries in Petén, Guatemala. They work with the Kekchi people, training national Kekchi pastors and working with them to plant churches. They have been there since August 2006. God has given them 4 children: twins Jonah and Silas, a daughter Eden, and their baby Titus. Their heart is for all the villages in Petén to be reached with the Gospel and to have a church with a trained national pastor who can help disciple new believers. The Kekchi Bible Institute (KBI), in Spanish, Instituto Bíblico Q'eqchi' (IBQ), is a 3 year pastors institute, where men called to be pastors can come.

Anna Chubb was serving in Togo, and briefly in Iraq, for ten years. Almost 3 years ago, she felt God leading her to move back to her hometown of Orlando. Through some very hard experiences of brokenness and the death of her brother who identified as gay, God has been giving her a deeper awe of the healing, transforming hope and grace of the Gospel that goes so much deeper than moralism and making idols of ministry success. She is now serving with ABWE North America's EveryEthne initiative. She travels with a team that presents seminars to help believers to move toward building grace and truth relationships with lost individuals who happen to identify as gay. She also serves locally in Orlando on a community college campus with a ministry outreach to international students who will, prayerfully, one day go back to their countries with the potential for great kingdom impact.

While studying the Cebuano language and Filipino culture in language school in Mindanao, Philippines, the Lord gave Dr. David Nelson a vision for equipping and multiplying pastors and church leaders.

In 2007, Crossing Cultures International (CCI) was created and by the end of 2016, the Lord was pleased to expand the ministry to 550 training classes in 31 countries with 6,200 pastors and church leaders in training and 3,500 graduates. Over 65 national coordinators oversee the training.

Jim and Hope Smith were happy serving in the church of their youth raising their four young children, but God had other plans. In 2005, God led them to Zambia (Africa) to help lead a team of missionaries, assist with two church plants, pioneer an orphan work, and build a large scale cattle operation for ministry sustainability.

In 2011, the Smiths shifted their base to Pretoria, South Africa where they remotely continue ministry in Zambia.

Marc and Charin began their ministry in Hungary in 1993.

Their four children were born there and speak perfect
Hungarian with no accent. In 2011, Charin and Marc
received their Hungarian citizenship, so now they are duel
citizens of the USA and Hungary. These steps have gone a
long way to helping them be accepted.

Over the last 25+ years, their focus has always been church planting. The Lord has allowed them to have a part in the establishment of three churches there.

The Slater family consists of John, Emily, Abigail, Josiah, Micah, and Noah. They live in Cork, Ireland. They share the Gospel with others and teach them to be committed followers of Jesus Christ. Their mission is to engage the culture, establish churches, and establish a Bible institute that will train Irish nationals to become pastors and missionaries in Ireland.

The 6 Degree Initiative is a church planting movement focusing on the unreached people groups just north of the equator in West Africa. This area spans the balmy African coast that has been greatly impacted most by Voodoo and the exportation of precious human life through the slave trade. JJ and Melissa Alderman, 6 Degree's founding missionaries, are partnering with national leaders to plant churches in the least-reached cities of the region. A concentrated church planting movement within these culturally significant cities serves as a launching pad for ministry into smaller communities. Currently, the five projects within the 6 Degree Initiative are: Togo Church Planting, Benin Church Planting, Togo Palms Camp and Institute, Deaf Project, Vocational Training. The Aldermans have teams leading each of these areas.

- Please pray for the expansion of our church planting team into Benin.
- We are asking God to grow the 9 churches currently in Togo to 20.
- Melissa has been facing health issues. Please pray for her healing.



Ron and Susan have been ministering in New York City since January of 2008. It is their God-given vision to launch churches in all 5 boroughs of NYC. God has truly given them an impossible task that only He will make possible. When they moved there in January of 2008, God opened the door for them to have a building in Queens. Their first church plant began in February of 2009 and God began blessing. In March of 2011, they re-located to Brooklyn into a diverse community which we had specifically been praying for. As a result of Hurricane Sandy in 2012, the Lord opened up another opportunity to launch a new work in Far Rockaway, Queens. Rockaway Beach Baptist Church launched on Easter Sunday of 2013 and they are more excited than ever about what God is doing through this ministry. They look forward to branching out into all of the boroughs over time as God allows.
